


It is only by the power of God that we are able to stand against evil. Trusting in God's grace, let us confess our sin.

SECOND READING: Exodus 33:12-23 REV. STANLEY JENKINS

¹²Moses said to the LORD, "See, you have said to me, 'Bring up this people'; but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, 'I know you by name, and you have also found favor in my sight.' ¹³Now if I have found favor in your sight, show me your ways, so that I may know you and find favor in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people." ¹⁴He said, "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." ¹⁵And he said to him, "If your presence will not go, do not carry us up from here. ¹⁶For how shall it be known that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us? In this way, we shall be distinct, I and your people, from every people on the face of the earth." ¹⁷The LORD said to Moses, "I will do the very thing that you have asked; for you have found favor in my sight, and I know you by name." ¹⁸Moses said, "Show me your glory, I pray." ¹⁹And he said, "I will make all my goodness pass before you, and will proclaim before you the name, "The LORD'; and I will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will show mercy on whom I will show mercy. ²⁰But," he said, "you cannot see my face; for no one shall see me and live." ²¹And the LORD continued, "See, there is a place by me where you shall stand on the rock; ²²and while my glory passes by I will put you in a cleft of the rock, and I will cover you with my hand until I have passed by; ²³then I will take away my hand, and you shall see my back; but my face shall not be seen."



CONGREGATIONAL LIFE

Colors of the Church Calendar Year

The colors we use in our Sanctuary mark different seasons in church life. We celebrate Christ the King Sunday today, with white and all of our colors to celebrate Jesus' victory over all evil in the world. Our colors – purple or blue for Advent, White for High Holy Days, Green for Common or Growing season, Purple for Lent, and Red for Pentecost are all represented today in our Worship space.

Next Sunday will be the first Sunday in Advent, the beginning of the church year, with purple or blue (for Mary), paraments. High Holy Days, like Christmas through Epiphany, the Easter season (48 days), All Saints Day and Christ the King are traditionally celebrated with white paraments. Lent, from Ash Wednesday through Palm Sunday is purple for the purple robe that Pilate insisted Jesus wear on his way to the cross. We use black on Good Friday for Jesus's death and then we take all color out of the Sanctuary to remember the utter desolation of Jesus's sacrifice. Pentecost is our only red day, for the fire of the Holy Spirit. The rest of the church year is celebrated with green – known as Common Time, but we prefer to think of it as Growing Time! **FPC MEN'S GROUP** will have a "get-together" on <u>Monday</u>, <u>December 9</u> starting at 5:30 PM at the home of Jim Donaldson (118 Green Meadows Dr., Lansing 48917).
