MUSIC NOTES with Megan Heigle

July/August 2024

Here in this place, the new light is streaming; now is the darkness vanished away; See in this space our fears and our dreamings brought here to you in the light of this day. Gather us in, the lost and forsaken; gather us in, the blind and the lame; Call to us now, and we shall awaken; we shall arise at the sound of our name. "Here In This Place" verse 1, Marty Haugen

While we offer our praise and worship to God for the summer months, the music at First Presbyterian understands that this time of vacations and sleeping in means that we will not always see each other on Sunday mornings. And that is OK! Finding ways to glorify God while taking a hike on a new-to-you trail; watching service on YouTube while snuggled in bed with the whole family; praising God for safe travels; spending time with friends, allowing God to be in the midst of you....

The hymn "Here in This Place" (GTG 401), composed by Marty Haugen in 1979 is considered a corporate prayer to God on behalf of a diverse congregation. Marty Haugen (b. 1950) was raised in the American Lutheran Church, worked as a church musician for the Roman Catholic Church and is currently the composer-in-residence at Mayflower Community Congregational Church in Minneapolis. He has over 400 compositions (hymns and liturgical music) published in hymnals, supplements, liturgical settings and choral anthems.

The text celebrates what "Here" means – where two or three are gathered – all while longing for the body of Christ (us!) to be transformed and used as witnesses to the Gospel.

The music staff lifts you in prayer that the music you hear and experience during these summer months uplifts, encourages and give you space to be in full communion with God, our creator and sustainer.






With daylight extending later into the evening, we will meet in the parlor during the warmer months. Our starting time will be 6:30, allowing us to drive home while it is still light.


Tuesday July 2, 6:30 in the parlor The Heaven & Earth Grocery Store by James McBride

In 1972, when workers in Pottstown, Pennsylvania, were digging the foundations for a new development, the last thing they expected to find was a skeleton at the bottom of a well. Who the skeleton was and how it got there were two of the long-held secrets kept by the residents of Chicken Hill, the dilapidated neighborhood where immigrant Jews and African Americans lived side by side and shared ambitions and sorrows. Chicken Hill was where Moshe and Chona Ludlow lived when Moshe integrated his theater and where Chona ran the Heaven & Earth Grocery Store. As these characters' stories overlap and deepen, it becomes clear how much the people who live on the margins of white, Christian



America struggle and what they must do to survive. When the truth is finally revealed about what happened on Chicken Hill and the part the town's white establishment played in it, McBride shows us that even in dark times, it is love and community—heaven and earth—that sustain us. Discussion led by Linda Diepenhorst.

Tuesday, August 6, 6:30 in the parlor Tom Lake: A Novel by Ann Patchett




In the spring of 2020, Lara's three daughters return to the family's orchard in Northern Michigan. While picking cherries, they beg their mother to tell them the story of Peter Duke, a famous actor with whom she shared both a stage and a romance years before at a theater company called Tom Lake. As Lara recalls the past, her daughters examine their own lives and relationship with their mother and are forced to reconsider the world and everything they

thought they knew. *Tom Lake* is a meditation on youthful love, married love, and the lives parents have led before their children were born. Both hopeful and elegiac, it explores what it means to be happy even when the world is falling apart. Discussion led by Elda Keaton.

Tuesday, September 3, 6:30 in the parlor The Only Woman in the Room: A Novel by Marie Benedict

She possessed both a stunning beauty and a stunning mind. Her beauty almost certainly saved her from the rising Nazi party and led to marriage with an Austrian arms dealer. Underestimated in everything else, she overheard the Third Reich's plans while at her husband's side, understanding more than anyone would guess. She devised a plan to flee in disguise from their castle, and the whirlwind escape landed her in Hollywood. She became Hedy Lamarr, screen star. But she kept a secret more shocking than her heritage or her marriage: She was a scientist, whose groundbreaking invention later revolutionized modern communication. And she knew a few secrets about the enemy.



She had an idea that might help the country fight the Nazis...if anyone would listen to her.

Youth (Middle and Senior High)!


